Aubrey K. McClendon

Aubrey K. McClendon has served as Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer of [Chesapeake Energy](#) since co-founding the company in 1989. From 1982 to 1989, Mr. McClendon was an independent producer of oil and gas. Mr. McClendon graduated from Duke University in 1981.



Ralph Eads

Ralph Eads is vice chairman of [Jefferies & Co., Inc.](#), a U.S. investment bank, where he chairs the firm's global energy section. In addition to serving on the Board of ACSF, Mr. Eads is a Trustee of Duke University. He also serves as chairman of Expectation Graduation, a program aimed at keeping kids in school that was started by Houston Mayor Bill White. He also has been active in the Nature Conservancy of Texas, the Houston Ballet, The Kinkaid School Foundation, and Small Steps.



Robert A. Hefner III

Robert A. Hefner III is the Founder and Chief Executive Officer of [GHK Production](#). Mr. Hefner, a professional geologist and geophysicist, is also the author of [The GET - The Grand Energy Transition](#) (Wiley, 2009). He graduated in 1957 from the University of Oklahoma where he first became interested in the deep gas potential of the Anadarko Basin of western Oklahoma and the Texas Panhandle. Upon graduation, he trained with Phillips Petroleum. Hefner worked briefly for his family at The Hefner Company before founding The GHK Company in 1959. Under Hefner's guidance, the privately owned GHK Company pioneered deep natural gas exploration in the Anadarko Basin. GHK's operations led to most of the technological innovation necessary to drill and produce the world's deepest and highest pressure natural gas wells, including many world records. In 1997, GHK discovered the Potato Hills natural gas field in the Ouachita overthrust belt of southeastern Oklahoma, one of the larger North American onshore natural gas fields found in recent decades. In the 1970's and 1980's, Hefner appeared frequently before Congressional committees testifying on energy matters. He has written and published numerous articles on the global importance of natural gas resources and the impact of U.S. policies on the natural gas industry and the economy. He continues his active management and exploration role at GHK, as well as serving on the Advisory Council at the Center for a New American Security, and the International Council at the Belfer Center for Science and International Affairs at the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard. Hefner is a member of the American Association of Petroleum Geologists, American Association of Professional Landmen, American Institute of Professional Geologists, Oklahoma Independent Petroleum Association, Society of Exploration Geophysicists and the Society of Independent Professional Earth Scientists.



Andrew J. Littlefair

Andrew J. Littlefair is President and Chief Executive Officer of [Clean Energy](#), and serves on the Board of Directors of the Company. Clean Energy is the largest provider of vehicular natural gas (CNG and LNG) and related services in North America. It has a broad customer base in the refuse, transit, shuttle, taxi, police, intrastate and interstate trucking, airport and municipal fleet markets with vehicles fueling at strategic locations in the United States and Canada. Mr. Littlefair also serves as Chairman of NGV America, based in Washington DC, a national organization dedicated to the development of a growing, sustainable and profitable market for vehicles powered by natural gas. Mr. Littlefair and NGV America were instrumental in gaining new federal legislation to encourage the growing use of alternative fuels for transportation in America. In 2004, Mr. Littlefair was named an NGV Champion by the International Association of Natural Gas Vehicles (IANGV), reflecting his contributions to the growing industry. Previously, Mr. Littlefair served as President of Pickens Fuel Corp (PFC), predecessor company of Clean Energy, which he co-founded in 1997 with Boone Pickens. Earlier, Mr. Littlefair served as Vice President of Public Affairs at MESA Inc., one of America's largest independent producers of natural gas. Before joining MESA in 1987, Mr. Littlefair was Staff Assistant to the President (Ronald Reagan) in the Office of Presidential Advance.



Thomas S. Price Jr.

Thomas S. Price, Jr. has served as Senior Vice President - Corporate Development for [Chesapeake Energy](#) since April 2005. He was Senior Vice President - Investor and Government Relations from April 2003 to April 2005, Senior Vice President - Corporate Development from 2000 to 2003, Vice President - Corporate Development from 1992 to 2000 and a consultant to the company during the prior three years. He was employed by Kerr-McGee Corporation, Oklahoma City, from 1988 to 1989 and by Flag-Redfern Oil Company from 1984 to 1988. Mr. Price is on the executive committee of the New Mexico Oil and Gas Association and a board member of the Oklahoma Independent Petroleum



Association. Mr. Price graduated from the University of Central Oklahoma in 1983, from the University of Oklahoma in 1989 and from the American Graduate School of International Management in 1992.
